Our school will be closed on this day as the school is used as a polling station and a large number of voters are expected to come onto our site throughout the day. The school street will not be operational on this day.

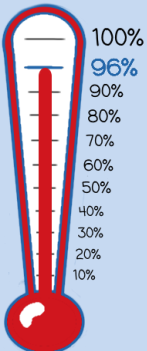

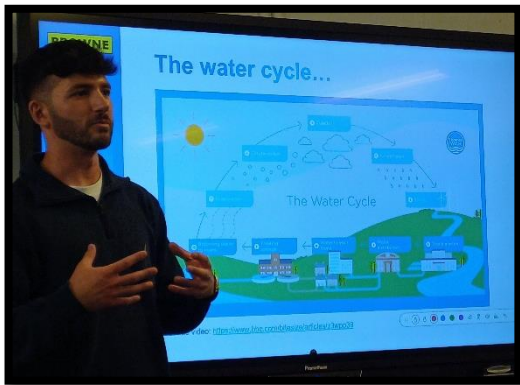

BROWNE

As year 5 are taking part in an Enfield Town Schools Partnership Science Fair, we were fortunate to have an information workshop from Browne Group (a utility services contractor that has been in business for over 50 years) about Sustainability and the water industry.

Sophia and Alessio from Browne delivered the workshops to the year 5 classes. They explained that they work with Thames Water to provide clean, safe drinking water to homes across London. They told us that they are replacing lots of water pipes because they are more than 100 years old, they burst a lot and they waste a lot of water.

We learned that there are 85,000 miles of pipes that could go around the world 3.5 times. We learned the role that Thames Water plays in the water cycle, e.g., treating water and sewage and getting water to our homes. They explained how the water and sewage treatment processes work.



They informed us about the huge amount of water that is wasted in London, we use 5 times more than necessary. They explained how much water an average daily household uses.

They want us to turn the tap off when brushing our teeth, take short showers. We then participated in a competitive quiz to test our knowledge of what we had learned during the session. Each class had 2 winning groups.



All of the children thoroughly enjoyed it and listened enthusiastically. They found the information interesting, especially learning about sewage treatment and what happens to water before it gets to our homes.

Some children thought that the workshop was amazing, the best, great, super fun, interactive, exciting and a wonderful experience.

June Family Home-learning Project

Our school values for the month of June are **Sustainability and Stewardship**.

These two words stand together and alone.

Sustainability: How do we take care of what is around us? How do we make what we have last? How do we promote a healthy planet and have a positive impact on the climate? How do we protect what we have?

Stewardship: How do we take care of ourselves, others and the world around us? How do we take responsibility? How are we role models?



Your task this month is to link the two ideas together and use your geographical knowledge!

Create a 3D model or piece of artwork that demonstrates something about the world around you! Consider the natural world, natural resources or natural features.



It could be:

- A volcano
- A river or canal
- An iceberg
- Meadows, parks or farmland
- A rainforest



Alongside your project, write a short paragraph, poem, labels or record yourself saying why it is important to protect these aspects of our natural world. What advice would you give people to protect it from potential harm? How are you also helping to protect them?

For an additional challenge, **if you are in Key Stage 2**, create a 3D model of a key feature in **our local area** using reused, recycled or waste cardboard as the main material.

It could be: A sports venue, place of worship, school, local farm, river/canal or hill

TO SAFEGUARD SCHOOL FUNDING

Dear Parents and Carers,

Further to the letter sent out by email, I write again to urge any of you whom have not previously applied for free school meals (FSM) to do so.

Whilst this may seem counter-intuitive, since all children are currently able to access FSM through the Mayor's scheme, a huge amount of our funding is based on the number of children we have who are **eligible for FSM under normal circumstances.**

Therefore, if you receive of one of the benefits listed below, it is vitally important to register for FSM, in order for the school to secure this funding. If your child is eligible for 'benefit assessed' FSM, the school receives 'Pupil Premium'; we use this money to improve our educational provision and resources and it is **essential that we do not lose it.** It allows us to offer, amongst other things, educational psychologist support, phonics programmes, LASS group, Nurture group, breakfast club, Place 2 Be and music lessons. None of this would be affordable if we did not receive Pupil Premium.

Children will be eligible for free school meals if their parent or carer receives one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of **no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month)**)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (**provided you do not also receive Working Tax Credit**) and have an annual gross income of no more than 16,190.
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

To register, please visit the school office for an application form or use the one attached to the email that went out this week. If your application is successful, you will be notified within 10 working days of receipt.

Please help us continue to offer the best education we can to your child(ren) by securing as much Pupil Premium funding as possible.
