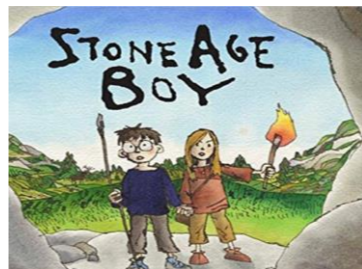

Autumn 1. Genre: Non-Fiction Text: Stone Age Boy

Writing Outcomes:

Children will explore the language and presentational features of personal recounts and progress to writing their own diary entry. Children will be able to retell a story from a different characters' perspective.



Key Vocabulary: recount, senses, imagination

Autumn 2. Genre: Fiction. Text: Fly Eagle, fly!

Writing Outcomes:

Children will explore the story set in a Ghanaian village and write a setting description and narrative.



We will also learn a fairy tale this term.

Key Vocabulary: senses, imagination, empathy.

Autumn 1. Skills to be taught:

Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number
Read, write, compare and order numbers up to 1,000
Solve number problems

Add and subtract numbers mentally, including columnar addition and subtraction
Estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check

Key vocabulary: place value, digit, order, calculate.

Autumn 2 Skills to be taught:

Focus on learning and re-call of the 3, 4 and 8 times table.
Children will use these multiplication facts to also divide numbers efficiently.

Key Text/ Books to Read at Home



	<p>Autumn 2. Plants We will be investigating plants, the different parts of a plant and their role in keeping a plant healthy. We will also look at how plants pollinate and make seeds. Key Vocabulary: stem, root, petal, leaves, anther, carpel.</p> 
<p>History Leadership Explore</p>	<p>Autumn 1. Stone Age We will understand what life was like in the Stone Age. Children will be encouraged to question the reliability of historical sources of information and learn about Skara Brae. Key Vocabulary: hunting / gathering, tribes, animal skin, weapons</p> 
<p>Geography Leadership Explore Outdoor Learning</p>	<p>Autumn 2. Hills and mountains We will explore the differences between mountains and hills and how people adapt to live in these environments. This will be supported with a local area walk where we will look at London and create a sketch map. Key Vocabulary: hill, mountain, slope, peak, summit, range.</p> 
<p>Religious Education Reflection Diversity and Equality</p>	<p>Why are festivals important to religious communities? We will be looking at the meaning of different religious celebrations and reflect on why they are important. Key Vocabulary: Festival, belief, celebration, Pesach, fasting.</p>
<p>Physical Education Leadership Outdoor Learning</p>	<p>Autumn 1: Children will be linking Dance Movements and Outdoor Adventure activities. Key Vocabulary: move, rhythm, link, sequence</p> <p>Autumn 2: Children will be exploring jumping and using different apparatus safely. Key vocabulary: jump, land, position, half turn, full turn.</p>
<p>Design and Technology Sustainability Outdoor Learning</p>	<p>Autumn 1: Upcycling textiles Children will make a wallet or a purse to hold money. Children will select a material to make it with and look at its properties which make it suitable to use. Key Vocabulary: textile, fabric, join, upcycle</p>
<p>Computing Explore</p>	<p>Autumn 2: Databases We will explore different types of databases. The children will create databases on paper before making online versions of these. Key Vocabulary: store, retrieve, database.</p>
<p>Music Nurture</p>	<p>Children will be exploring songs and use musical instruments to create music. Key Vocabulary: beat, listen, repeat</p>
<p>French Enthusiasm Diversity and Equality</p>	<p>Autumn 1. The children will be learning how to greet each other, introduce Family Members, order numbers and colours.</p> 
<p>PSHE and Citizenship Reflection Diversity and Equality</p>	<p>Autumn 1. We want children to make a positive start to the school year. We will explore themes like School Values, Relationships, Resolving Conflicts, and Taking responsibility for behaviours</p> <p>Autumn 2. There are a lot of key events in the run up to the end of the year including anti-bullying week, road safety and children in need. The children will also learn how to identify and express emotions in a respectful way. Key Vocabulary: conflict, resolve, responsibility, emotions</p>
<p>Climate Change Sustainability</p>	<p>Children will understand the importance of re-using materials. The Stone Age provides a topic to understand how materials were used and re-purposed and D&T will give children the opportunity to up-cycle textiles.</p>
