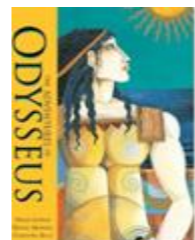

Solid, liquid or gas?

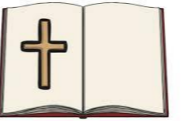
Autumn 1:

 Group materials based on their properties, changes of state, heating and cooling, the water cycle.
 Key Vocabulary: solids, liquids, gases, changes of state, heating, cooling, water cycle.

 Eating, teeth, digestive system and food chains, producers, predators and prey.
 Key vocabulary: baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult, puberty, human, grow.

 Key Vocabulary: ancient, civilisation, city states, empire, legacies, democracy, myth.

How did trade become global?
 Global trade. Link to Ancient Greek trade.
