




Books we have read when introducing our School Vision

In the past weeks, our school leadership team has put under the spotlight the different components of our vision for our LEARNERS. We have used the following great picture books stories to illustrate these:








Black History Month October 2024



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Year 3 fossils

In last week's newsletter, we featured that the year 3 children have been learning about rocks and how fossils are formed. We were lucky enough to have a workshop with GeoBus and the children investigated different fossils using 3D glasses.





After hearing about our work on fossils and seeing the newsletter, Mr. Darren Dunstone-Patterson, father of Freya in 3F, came forward and said he was a real- life palaeontologist and searched for fossils in his spare time.

The best part was that he brought in different fossils for the children to observe. It was incredible to hold a fossil that was from the time of the dinosaurs!





On Thursday, our PoW football team competed in their next round of fixtures for the season. Having picked up our first points last week in torrential conditions, the boys came flying out of the blocks in the first of three games.
