Through the story of The Rainbow Fish and with the help of a group volunteers, Father Stephen reflected on the importance of sharing and kindness.

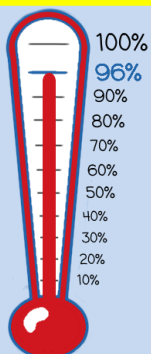

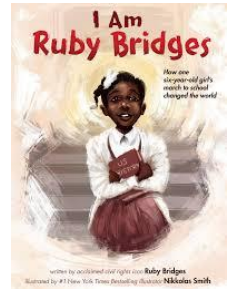
October Family Home-learning Project

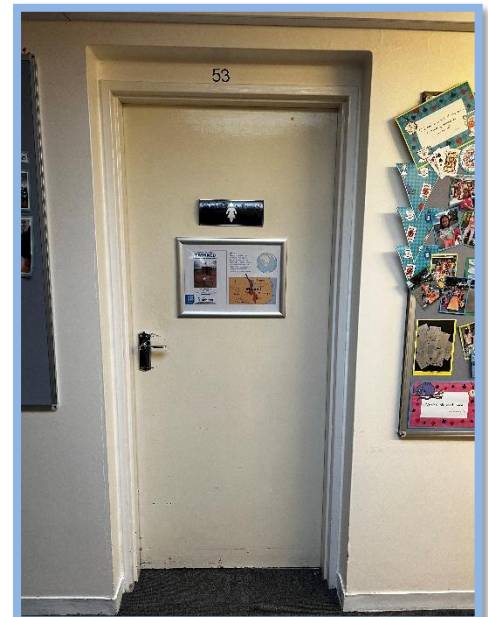
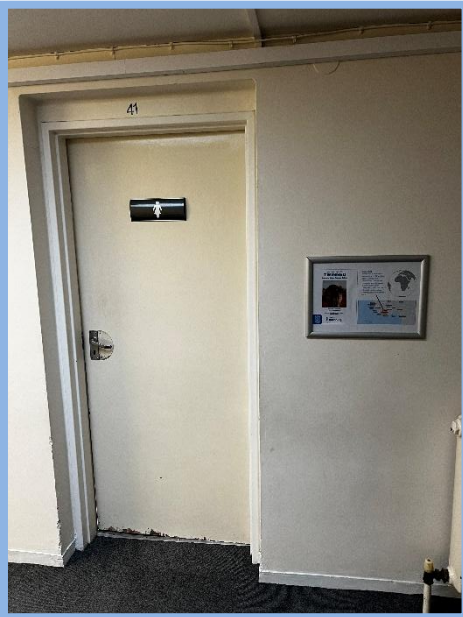
