Our school value for the month of October is Leadership, and, this year, we are introducing the first of our LEARNERS characters: Lenny!


Leadership

CROSS COUNTRY







Last Friday, I took 5 girls and 5 boys to Forty Hall County Park to take part in cross country. After walking half of the route to get the runners familiar with it, the girls lined up ready to begin. The route started by running downhill and although some other runners fell over, our girls stayed sturdy on their feet. After what felt like 5 minutes, the girls were back. The last 200m were uphill to the finish and they all finished incredibly strong! We had Valentina (21), Olivia (53), An'niya (55), Lillie-Mae (61) and Anna (110).

Without delay, the boys lined up ready to begin in the same place as the girls. There was some jostling at this point and you could feel the tension in the air. The boys took off and sped down the hill and again, before we knew it, they were on the uphill to the finish line. We had Reggie (7), Rome (77), Aayden (85), Joseph (88) and Abdul (95). The girls ran alongside them up the hill screaming their support to get them over the finish line.

Overall, the girls came 14^{th} out of 26 schools and boys came 10^{th} out of 27 schools. Our position overall was 11^{th} out of 26 schools.

Thank you parents for your support, especially Olivia's mum who volunteered to be a marshal on the course.




