






Year 3 Christmas Café

What's it all about?



Walker Children's Club at Prince of Wales School is there to help when you have last minute, urgent childcare needs after school.


Registering your children through our website is free, you only pay if you need us to collect your children.

Special Educational Needs (SEN) Team and School SENCos to talk to you about EHCPs, the role of the school SENCos and other important things to know if your child has additional needs at school.

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ECASS Occupational Therapist to explore how you can support your child to develop their skills and independence. To discuss the transition and typical expectations in Reception.

Enfield National Autistic Society A Parent/Carer forum sharing their personal experience of helping their children when starting school and their journey so far.

Enfield Advisory Service for Autism discussing support for parents and addressing questions about Autism, while exploring transitions.

Early Years and SEND Inclusion Team to discuss and provide you with strategies and tips to support your child's transition to Reception. Making parents and carers aware of the EYFS Transition booklets 'From home to school' and 'From a setting to school

ECASS Occupational Therapist to explore how you can support your child to develop their skills and independence. To discuss the transition and typical expectations in Reception.

Enfield Communication Advisory Support Service This session will raise awareness of support available to your child through ECASS. \$

Enfield Educational Psychology Service They will share tips and strategies to help you to prepare you and your child for the changes ahead. This session has been planned to consider both child and parent emotional wellbeing.

Early Years Speech and Language Therapists to discuss and explore supporting your child with talking, listening and making friends.

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Meet some of our fabulous school staff Meet a teacher from a local school, in Enfield, who will talk to you about your child's first year at school.
